C. E. M. S.

A Meeting of the South Forest Federation of the C.E.M.S. was held at the National Schools, Bream on Saturday, May 5th. The Rev. R. P. Steer, Tidenham, President pro-tem, presided over a large gathering of representatives from the various branches in the Deanery.

After a short service of Intercessions, the President referred to the anxious time experienced by the parish of Bream by reason of the vacancy in the benefice, and on behalf of the members present expressed the hope that the appointment of a new Incumbent would not be long delayed.

He also announced that earlier in the day the Executive Committee of the Federation had unanimously elected the Rev. J. Hayes, Vicar of St. Briavels, to be President for the ensuing year. Mr. Hayes could be assured of every support in carrying out the duties of that office. The next Meeting of the Federation would be held in the Parish of the new President on Saturday, July 21st.

It was decided to hold the January meeting of the Federation at Newnham.

The Secretary reported that two other Federations in the Diocese had passed resolutions on the subject of throwing open all parts of

Gloucester Cathedral, and these had been forwarded to the Diocesan Union.

A hearty vote of thanks to the Rev. R. P. Steer for presiding brought the meeting to a close, after which the members partook of tea, provided by the Bream Branch, a number of local ladies kindly assisting at the tables, &c.

Sunday School Training Week.

The Gloucester Diocesan Sunday School Association is arranging a week of training in Sunday School work for Clergy, Teachers and

others interested in religious education, at Cheltenham from July 16th to 21st.

Lectures will be held and sleeping accommodation given to students at St. Mary's Hall (Training College), and meals will be provided near by for an inclusive fee of £1. The Principal of St. Paul's Training College and members of the Sunday School Institute staff are giving Courses of Lectures, and there will be Demonstration Classes or Schools each day. Special Courses are being arranged for teachers who can only come in the evening, planned conveniently for 'buses and trains.

Monetary help is offered by the Diocesan Sunday School Association to teachers who are not able to afford the whole fee.
